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and 2.2.4 revisionfx re: match 2.0.1 and 2.2.4 Oct 14, 2010 For those of you who don't know, revfx is a little thing I built on top of .NET's regex module. I wanted to allow the regular expression engine to be used in a browser, while writing my own rules for use in web apps. One of the main features of my engine is the ability to give a "precision" parameter that tells it how many characters to match in order to say that two strings are the same. By default, this is set to two (or 1 if I haven't already matched), but I wanted to be able to get more precision by using the '?' symbol. So I created a new set of rules. This is the engine's test string, but its not what you'll be using. In this example, I'm matching on the word 'sort'. So the question is, can you match on a pattern that includes the '?' symbol? This is actually a feature that I didn't think about in the initial release of revfx, so I've created a revision that should fix the issue. revisionfx (2.2.4) revisionfx (2.2.5) The new version fixes the issue. My engine will

let you pass in parameters in two different ways. You can either use the parameter by name, which will create a variable, or you can use the parameter by position. If you pass the parameter with name, and its defined in the regex, then it will be substituted as part of the regex. I just use this to create a regex variable for use elsewhere. Thanks for the feedback, and sorry for the confusion. For future use of the engine, I would suggest that you use the version number instead of the revision number in the future. This is the engine's test string, but its not what you'll be using. In this example, I'm matching on the word'sort'.

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
